During Zoom sessions, did your chapter have members you could count on to attend regular rehearsals? Were they the same ones every week? If so, I want to thank each of you for helping to keep your chapter together. For those who did not want to or unable to participate, I understand, virtual rehearsals just weren't the same. However, I trust you have returned to in-person rehearsals and are back helping your chapter rebuild. It is through working together we can return to and surpass our membership goals.

These past eight months have given me a huge challenge as your incoming VP of Membership & Outreach. With all our chapters in turmoil just trying to keep our membership staying constant or climbing, each chapter seems to be consumed with all they can handle at the moment. For all of us, it's rebuilding and returning to the way we were. For me, it's all about YOU, the member - because EVERY MEMBER COUNTS! There are so many ways I could help, directions I could go, there needed to be an effective team willing to go the distance with me. - ♪ share the latest about ideas, suggestions, reminders.

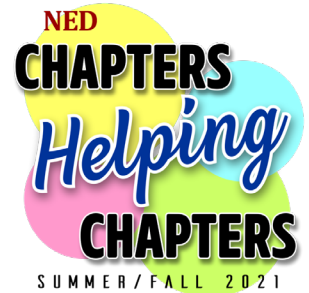

Another initiative I felt would be helpful for all of us is to **share** information. Hence, we began the **Chapters Helping Chapters** initiative. I believe if each chapter shared with other chapters some of their strategies/goals in their rebuilding process, it might stir a new thought/new way for other chapters to proceed, one idea at a time. For example, answers to the following questions might be helpful to share. If you have an answer that your chapter has found works, share that with others - submit to me now! We can't assume we are all at the same level; some of us might like a little nudge:



- » How are chapters handling the current lack of parts (e.g., no tenors or baris) to help return songs to performance level? What do you suggest if our chapter policy is vaccinated members only and our only tenor or bari is unvaccinated?
- » How can we develop a marketing plan when everything remains so unsettled?
- » Should we really consider having a chorus dinner and invite guests at this time or invite perspective members to a rehearsal? Isn't it too risky?
- » We are hoping to hold our show and/or holiday concert. How do we distribute flyers, place notices in church bulletins and further get the word out with everything being so iffy?

There are so many areas of concern for all of us. By sharing information with each other, we will be able to more efficiently help each other get back on track. **We can make this program successful by sharing!** See some examples of how our chapters are meeting these challenges - now posted online on the NED web site (more on that below).

3. Other Chapter News

After a very successful Singing Valentine event in February 2020 the Saratoga Springs NY chapter suspended chapter meetings the first Tuesday in March due to the rising risk of infections due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Little did we realize that it would be eighteen months before we could meet as a chapter again inside without a mask and vaccination by one of the approved vaccines. >>>



We discovered new ways to sing and meet weekly with 'ZOOM'. Under director **Rich Gervais** we added five new songs to our repertoire with learning tracks. ZOOM also provided a better way to hold chapter board and music committee meetings without traveling and providing a place to meet. Every Tuesday evening we laughed and had a lot of fun telling jokes, reminisced about past shows and videos of quartets, and sang. It was fun but like all barbershoppers, we missed singing live!

We started preparing for our first show appearance at Lake George, NY outdoor theater at Shepard's Park in the village. The Racing City Chorus, Saratoga's own **Remnants** quartet, and featured guest quartet **High Rollers** with **Mike & Chuck Packevicz, Jack Fair and Bill Wright** put on an hour show to a large audience. We started up the **B.o.B** (Barbershop on Broadway) again singing downtown every Thursday evening. We have also started meeting once a month in southern Saratoga County in Clifton Park, to draw guests from the capital district area. The future looks bright again and it's great to be singing live again!

It's been a long time comin', but the **Danbury Mad Hatter Chorus** is back! Barbershop harmony is being heard again in the hills of western Connecticut and eastern New York.

Chorus quartets got our post-pandemic schedule started by appearing twice in June, most notably, **Blue Moon** entertained passers-by on Ridgefield, CT's, Main Street during Make Music Day, a free celebration of music held in venues around the world every summer solstice. The full chorus made its debut at Atria Assisted Living, also in Ridgefield. The sound was a bit rusty at the start, but things came together with the nods and smiles of a lively audience.

We've also presented the National Anthem at a number of Danbury Westerners baseball games and learned that we are quite adept at conjuring rainstorms. The Westerners, by the way, is a collegiate summer baseball team based in Danbury, CT, and is a member of the New England Collegiate Baseball League.

Most important, our Annual Show, **Disney Melodies**, is scheduled for September 25, at 2PM and again at 7PM, at the Church of Christ, 90 Clapboard Ridge Road, in Danbury. For those whose entertainment travel range does not include Danbury, the show will be available virtually.

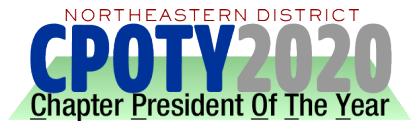

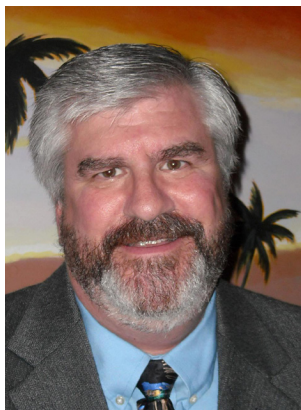

5. In Memorium – Steve LeClaire



It is with great sadness to report that long time NED member **Steve LeClaire**, most recently of the **Central Connecticut** and **Manchester** chapters, passed away earlier this month after a 12-year battle with cancer. Steve was an inspiration to us all, not only in how he lived and loved our hobby, but also in how he approached the end of his life in such a positive and uplifting manner. Steve was a force at both the district and chapter level. He ran a very successful **Harmony Explosion Northeast Camps** and also organized the very first **Connecticut Day of Harmony**. Both events reached hundreds of youth and spread Steve's love of Barbershop. He also served on both boards of the Manchester Chapter and Central Connecticut chapter, taking on the task of raising awareness of both chapters in the community and obtaining corporate sponsorships. No matter what the task, Steve was ready to volunteer and was successful.

At heart though, Steve loved music and singing. He loved to perform no matter what the occasion. If a chapter chorus needed a tenor in order to perform, Steve was always there. He was dual member in many chapters, in addition to the Manchester and Central Connecticut chapters, and in some cases, his membership kept those chapters alive. Steve was a fixture on the contest stage as well, competing with many different quartets in contest, often times just to give a new member a chance to compete and perform for the first time. This was on top of competing with his choruses. He said on many occasions, it was his singing and performing that kept him going during his battle with cancer. A



large gathering of members representing the **Manchester, Central Connecticut, Waterbury-Derby** and **Hartford** chapters attended a memorial service celebrating Steve's life. We sang "The Irish Blessing" - one of Steve's favorites. I'm sure he heard us and was smiling.
